What: A CLE presented by Georgia Appleseed Center for Law and Justice on community services for people found Incompetent to Stand Trial-Nonrestorable (IST-N). Presented in partnership with the Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities (DBHDD) and Atlanta Legal Aid Society.

Who should attend: Public defenders, prosecutors, judges, forensic social workers, and community mental health providers. (Approved for: 5 CLE hours, including 1 Ethics hour; 6 Social Work CEU hours.)

What you'll learn:

- The forensic hospital procedures that affect an IST-N individual's release, including discharge planning activities, annual evaluations, and risk assessments
- The community services that are available to IST-N individuals, including Community Integration Homes, forensic apartments, Assertive Community Treatment Teams, Developmental Disability Medicaid waiver supports, and the Georgia Housing Voucher Program
- The law governing an IST-N individual's continued civil commitment, including an examination of both the outpatient and inpatient civil commitment criteria. Hear from a civil Legal Aid advocate, a public defender, and a prosecutor
- How to address stigma associated with IST-N individuals. Hear a forensic peer mentor share his story
- How judges approach IST-N cases
